

ABOUT THE REPORT

Estimated agricultural production values are intended only as general guidelines to indicate agricultural activity and economic impact. The enclosed data are for educational purposes only and are subject to revision. Texas A&M AgriLife/Texas A&M University System does not support the use of these data for tax assessment valuation.

The data on the estimated value of agricultural production and related items were prepared from county projections provided in January by County Extension Agents, Extension Program Councils, and Extension Economists. Estimates made in January are subject to price changes and growing and harvesting conditions for the remainder of the season. Government payments are not included.

Production values reflect estimates by crop season, livestock marketing times, and average market price or Commodity Credit Corporation loan rate, whichever is higher. The value of commodities used on the farm is included. As a result, production values normally total slightly greater than cash receipts.

Real production value is current production value adjusted for inflation with 2005 as the base year. This value was developed using the Council of Economic Advisers' most recent GDP implicit price deflators (*Economic Indicators*, Council of Economic Advisers, U.S. Government Printing Office, March 2015).

Economic impact values were developed using IMPLAN output multipliers (IMPLAN Group, LLC. 2013. IMPLAN Professional Version 3.0., Huntersville, North Carolina). These values estimate the state economic impact of the listed agricultural commodities from farm gate through the supply chain.

Some listed commodities are aggregates of lesser categories. "Melons" includes cantaloupes and honeydews. "Nursery" includes bedding and potted plants, cut flowers, stock, and turf. "Other Crops" includes sprigs, legume seed, and grass seed. "Other Poultry" includes pullets, quail, and other fowl. "Other Beef" includes beef breeder cattle, beef and dairy calves, value-added by stocker cattle, and slaughter cattle. "Hogs" includes hogs and feeder pigs. "Timber" includes lumber and firewood.

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





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

Agricultural Production in Texas, 2014


Percentage of Total Value by Top Ranked Commodities





Percentage of Total Production Value by District*




**Percentage of Total

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





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





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





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





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





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





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





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





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





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





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





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





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
