#### Three Main Purposes

- For fiber
- For seed (grain and replication)
- For Cannabinoids (CBD and others)

### Growing Hemp: Fiber

- Grown much like other forage crops.
- Being close to a processor is critical for grower profits.
- Fiber currently has limited processing facilities in this country.
- However, it may have the most potential of all hemp end markets.
  - Potential uses are many, but it must be economical

## Growing Hemp: Grain

- Challenge of seed shatter when harvested
- Due to human consumption, the seed needs to be cleaned and stored properly. (need a contract)
- Hulled hemp seed, hemp seed protein powder, and hemp seed oil are generally recognized as safe (GRAS) by FDA.

## Growing Hemp: CBD

- CBD is driving most the headlines and interest. Also has had the most acres planted in the U.S.
- Prices have fallen but seem to have stabilized some as supply and demand try to find equilibrium.
- Is this a supplement or is this a drug/medicine? The answer has implications for the industry.
- Harvesting approach is key especially for larger acres.





#### Final Thoughts

- Many opportunities but considerable amounts of uncertainty remain
- Markets development for hemp grain and fiber will be important
- CBD is driving the market currently
  - Further clarification in regulation will be big for the industry
  - Continued growth in demand is needed to keep prices from falling further as supply has outpaced demand recently
- Processing will have to catch up to supply





#### Final Thoughts

- Contracts will be vital for growers
  - There are many types of contracts
  - Know what you are responsible for and what the processor is too.
  - Are there any "outs" for the processor
- Hemp is likely to be another alternative crop for some, but the "silver bullet" days appear to be over
